Students at Manorbrook Primary School wrote persuasive pieces about conservation, their local area and why you should buy local produce. Year 5 students in Thornbury completed a persuasive writing project in which they researched, interviewed and developed their writing skills before having their writing published on the Forgotten Landscape Website.





They then invited the farmer to their school and devised some questions to find out more about his work



The students then used the answers to his questions and their research to write a persuasive piece about the area.

Students began by researching a local farm. They investigated farming in their local area and organisations involved in conservation.



The farmer visited the school and was questioned by the students about his farm, his animals, the local area and his methods of conservation.
