What is stop frame animation?


- The object is moved in small steps each time a photograph (frame) is taken. When these photographs are played back at speed it makes the illusion that things are really moving.
- Use figures with movable joints can easily be moved about and repositioned using an




How do I get it to move?

- And your characters!








- The red button takes a picture.
- Left from that (the eye) switches between live (what is in front of the camera) and the last picture taken.
- · Left to that the line is 'Onion Skin' This allows you to set the image between the last picture and live to compare a fran
- Left from that is the play button.
- The numbers are the number of frames you have taken and
- right on the left hand side the little picture symbol allows you to go to all frames and remove/edit any and
- the little circles next to that takes you back to the main screen and out of edit mode

Helpful words!

- Animation a way of making a movie by using a series of drawings, computer graphics, or photographs of objects (such as puppets or models) that are slightly different from one another and that when viewed quickly one after another create the appearance of movement
- Stop frame or stop motion
- Frame- each photograph or still picture
- Armature- the 'skeleton' on which you model your character on.
- Magnetic assist stage- stage is magnetic so limbs stay in the right place.
- Storyboard- key pictures show the most important parts of the story
- **Editing** making changes to your work
- Onion skin- being able to see the frame you are on and the one before
